People Who Can Help

Over 100 **RCCs (Resident Computer Consultants)** are located throughout the residences to provide support for personal computers, technology education, consulting, and local support for computer-equipped study spaces.

About 30 **consultants at the Meyer Tech Desk** provide technology consulting in the Multimedia Studio, equipment checkout, and poster printing services in a central location. Items available for overnight checkout with a Stanford ID card include laptops, camcorders, projectors, external hard drives, digital video cameras, and AV cables.



Course Opportunities

RCCs offer workshops and teach two for-credit courses in residences with first-year students: **CS1C, Introduction to Computing at Stanford**; and **CS2C, Multimedia Production at Stanford**. An advanced section of CS2C is offered at Meyer Library.

Public Computers

About 750 centrally-managed computers and kiosks put the **latest courseware, productivity and multimedia software** at your fingertips. These spaces are also equipped with laser printers, scanners, and other equipment.



They are available in the following locations, some of which are open 24 hours a day:

Meyer, Green, and other libraries

Both standard and specialized computers and printing are available in the libraries. The first floor of Meyer is open 24 hours a day; the second floor also houses the Meyer Tech Desk poster printing and equipment checkout services.

Stanford Digital Language Laboratory

The multilingual computing and communication hub on campus supporting foreign language computing, skyping, and Language Center testing, located on the second floor of Meyer Library.

Tresidder Union

Standard computers with courseware, productivity software, and some multimedia software as well as printers are available 24 hours a day.

Student Community Centers

Computers are also available in locations that support your activities outside of class.

Residential Computing Spaces

Managed by your RCC, these spaces are available in the area where you live and provide convenient access to computers and printing.

Learning Spaces

We support over 35,000 square feet of **computer and AV-equipped study spaces, classrooms, and labs** in Meyer Library and Tresidder Union, much of it available 24 hours a day. 80 residential computing and enhanced study spaces are located throughout the undergraduate houses and regionally in the graduate residences.



Online Resources

CourseWork

A cutting-edge learning management system/collaborative learning environment that allows you to access your course materials online and provides online learning opportunities.

Printing

An online print-release system makes sure that you don't accidentally print all of that 500 page PDF and get charged for it.

Network Registration System

You can register for internet online as soon as you open up a browser window. Through this process, computers are checked for viruses and security software to keep your computer clean and safe.

Residential Networks

In partnership with Information Technology Services, we support **internet connections and wireless networking** throughout student residences.

Your RCC can help you connect to the Internet on campus from just about any network-enabled device, such as smart phones, iPods, and iPads.
